Re: Leadership Commitment to the Seven (7) Principles of Public Life

I am writing jointly to you in furtherance of the Series of Anti-Corruption and Good Governance Workshops that were conducted by the Integrity Commission for the benefit of the Cabinet of the Government of Jamaica, as well as for the benefit of the Shadow Cabinet.

The Workshops were respectively administered by the Integrity Commission between November 9, 2020 and February 15, 2021, in the case of the Cabinet, and between November 15, 2021 and May 30, 2022, in the case of the Shadow Cabinet.

In a further effort to promote adherence to the highest standards of good governance and integrity on the part of those who discharge public functions and duties in Jamaica, the Integrity Commission is of the considered view that Public Bodies and Officials to whom the Commission has administered its Anti-Corruption and Good Governance Workshops, should be asked to formally commit to the **Seven Principles of Public Life**.

It is in furtherance of that objective, therefore, that I now take pleasure in submitting to you, for your review and formal subscription, the attached Leadership Commitment Document, and will look forward to your timely and positive response to the Commission's overture.

The Integrity Commission and the Most Hon. Prime Minister of Jamaica and his Cabinet

Whereas The Most Honourable Andrew Michael Holness, Prime Minister of Jamaica and his Cabinet participated in a series of Anticorruption and Good Governance Workshops that were held by the Integrity Commission between November 9, 2020 and February 15, 2021 and which covered the understated topics:

- The problem of corruption
- An overview of Jamaica's anticorruption framework
- Principles of Good Governance and Integrity in Government, Public Office and Public Life
- Public Procurement Overview
- Other Critical Areas Involving the Integrity Commission's Oversight
- Statutory Declarations
- Protected Disclosures Act Whistleblowing
- Reporting Allegations of Corruption
- Investigating Allegations of Corruption
- Prosecuting Allegations of Corruption
- Overview of Corruption Offences in Jamaica
- International Best Practices in Anti- Corruption and Anti-Bribery

And whereas the Prime Minister and his Cabinet successfully completed participation in the aforestated workshops.

And whereas the Prime Minister and his Cabinet agree in principle to uphold the knowledge and philosophy imparted from the course and commit to upholding the seven principles of public life in their dealings and interactions within and outside the public sector, that is, the principles of:

Selflessness

Holders of public office should act solely in terms of the public interest. They should not do so in order to gain financial or other material benefits for themselves, their family, or friends.

Integrity

Holders of public office should not place themselves under any financial or other obligation to individuals or organizations that might seek to encourage improper behavior in the performance of their official duties.

Objectivity:

In carrying out public business, including making public appointments, awarding contracts, or recommending individuals for rewards and benefits, holders of public office should make choices on merit

Accountability:

Holders of public office are accountable for their decisions and actions to the public and must submit themselves to whatever scrutiny is appropriate to their office.

Openness:

Holders of public office should be as open as possible about all the decisions and actions that they take. They should give reasons for their decisions and restrict information only when the wider public interest clearly demands.

Honesty

Holders of public office have a duty to declare any private interests relating to their public duties and to take steps to resolve any conflicts arising in a way that protects the public interest.

Leadership:

Holders of public office should promote and support these principles by leadership and example

The Commitment

Therein with this commitment, I, the Prime Minister of Jamaica, and the Members of my Cabinet, do hereby agree to adhere to and exhibit the above-mentioned ethical principles in our behavior and the conduct of our affairs in the discharge of our public duties, and do solemnly undertake to actively promote and robustly support the implementation of the commitments incorporated within this document and to challenge conflicting behavior wherever it occurs.
